INTRODUCTION

The Administrative Staff College of India (ASCI) announces a training programme on '**Achieving Universal Urban Sanitation**' during **January 22-24, 2018**. The programme aims to provide enhanced knowledge and skills to policy makers and practitioners at state level, in urban local governments and parastatal agencies in the realization of sanitation goals set out in the **Swachh Bharat Mission (SBM)**.

CONTEXT

Sanitation remains one of the major development challenges in India. A fourth of the urban population in India lacks access to safe sanitation facilities and only 30% to 40% is served by sewerage and wastewater treatment systems. Open defecation is widely prevalent in many cities and towns resulting in undermining environmental sanitation and public health. The Ministry of Urban Development (MoUD), Government of India, recently launched the Swachh Bharat Mission (SBM) scheme for eliminating open defecation and for enhancing sanitation and public health outcomes in urban areas by providing technical and financial support to state and city governments. The SBM aims to achieve the goals of National Urban Sanitation Policy (NUSP) 2008.

The SBM aims to: a) Eliminate open defecation b) Effect behavioral change for healthy sanitation practices c) Augment capacity of ULBs d) Strategize Information, Education & Communication (IEC) and generate public awareness on sanitation and its linkage with public health e) Create an enabling environment for private sector participation in Capital and O&M expenditure.

The training programme aims to provide an in depth understanding of policy formulation, strategic planning, technical, financial, social, institutional aspects in achieving city wide sanitation and making cities free from open defecation.

OBJECTIVES

The core objectives of the training programme are to provide:

- Comprehensive understanding of policy, strategic planning and models to achieve universal access to sanitation services for urban population particularly the urban poor
- Knowledge and skills required to develop City Level Sanitation Plans, State Sanitation Concept and State Level Sanitation Strategy that encompass modern scientific management of solid waste, faecal sludge management, elimination of open defecation by creation of household toilets, community toilets and toilets in schools
- Technology solutions for sanitation improvement - centralized and decentralized options
- IEC strategies and generation of public awareness to effect behavioral change in sanitation practices and its linkage with public health outcomes
- Financing options for sanitation and exploring possibilities of collaborative service delivery modes leveraging PPP, CSR etc.
- Insight into innovations and good practices (National and International) related to urban sanitation
- Capacity building and education to achieve universal sanitation

PROGRAMME STRUCTURE AND CONTENT

The programme is structured to offer both conceptual and practical skills. Classroom sessions will be interspersed with case studies, field visits, interaction, discussions, presentations and participant group work.

The course modules cover :

(I) Policy and Institutional framework for sanitation —national, state & city level (ii) Developing baseline information (iii) City - wide/ sector-wide approaches to achieve universal sanitation (iv) Technology choices for coverage, treatment and disposal of Municipal Solid Waste (MSW) and Fecal Waste (v) Planning for the urban poor through creation of household toilets, community and shared toilets (vi) Planning and financing sanitation - choice of effective modes including PPP and CSR (viii) Demand Generation, Education, Consultation and Communication (ix) Capacity Building for Sanitation (x) Identification and sharing of good practices in SWM and Fecal Sludge Management (FSM)

LEARNING METHODOLOGY

The programme features an interactive learning approach with a blend of lectures, discussions, case studies, short films, individual and group exercises, exchange of experiences and field visits. In addition, the programme offers opportunities for participants to interact with experts and practitioners.

RESOURCE PERSONS

Eminent urban sanitation sector experts, senior policy makers and practitioners will provide resource support for the training.

PROGRAMME PARTICIPATION

The programme will benefit policy makers, practitioners from state and city governments, elected leaders, representatives, municipal commissioners, public health engineers, municipal health officers, and database administrators from urban local bodies/ water utilities, district officials involved in school sanitation etc.

VENUE

Classrooms are well appointed with air conditioning and A/V equipment; in addition, participants can use the library and computer

centre. The Programme is fully residential and the participants will be accommodated in single air-conditioned rooms. The College does not provide accommodation for the family. Transport between airport / railway station and Venue will be arranged by the College. The Bella Vista Campus is Wi-Fi enabled.

DURATION

The Programme is from January 22 - 24, 2018. **The participants are expected to arrive a day before and may leave after the completion of the programme.**

PROGRAMME FEE

A Program fee of **Rs. 34,000/-** (US\$1495 - if foreign) plus 18% GST per participant will be charged to cover tuition, board and lodging, courseware (in electronic form) and other facilities of the College including internet usage.

Rs.28,000/- plus 18% GST for Indian participants not availing hostel accommodation will be charged to cover tuition, course ware (in electronic form) working lunch and other facilities of the College including internet usage.

A discount of 10% on the Program fee for three or more participants from the same organisation will be given, provided the payment is made in to our Bank account before Tuesday, January 19, 2018. Bank details are given below.
